In this class, we apply the Equality of <u>Opportunity</u> concept. All students begin on the <u>same</u> day, receive the <u>same</u> course information & have the <u>same</u> amount of time to complete the coursework. While there is no guarantee that students will earn a respectable grade, all students are given the <u>opportunity</u> to earn a respectable grade.

Classroom

- Hypothetically, if we applied the Equality of <u>Outcome</u> concept in this class, all students would be <u>guaranteed</u> to receive the class average grade.
- The grade would be determined by combining all points earned (by the class as a whole) & dividing them equally among each student. All students would earn the same grade regardless of their performance.
- Unless the class average were unusually high or unusually low, the most likely result would be <u>all</u> students would earn a grade in the "C" range (C+, C or C-). Grades in the "C" range are generally considered to be average grades.
